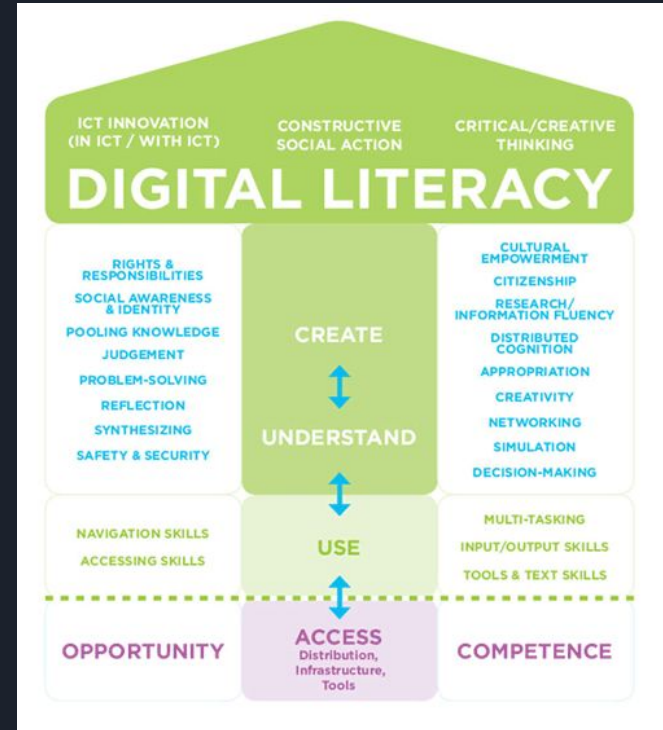

# What is digital literacy? Why is it important?

Digital Literacy: The ability to use technology to **navigate, evaluate and create** information.

Digital literacy skills are central to citizenship, innovation and communication.



# Why is digital literacy important for seniors?

- Increase social connection
- Reduce senior poverty
- Encourage lifelong learning
- Promote identity-building and self-confidence
- Lifelong learning
- Decrease the cultural gap between generations

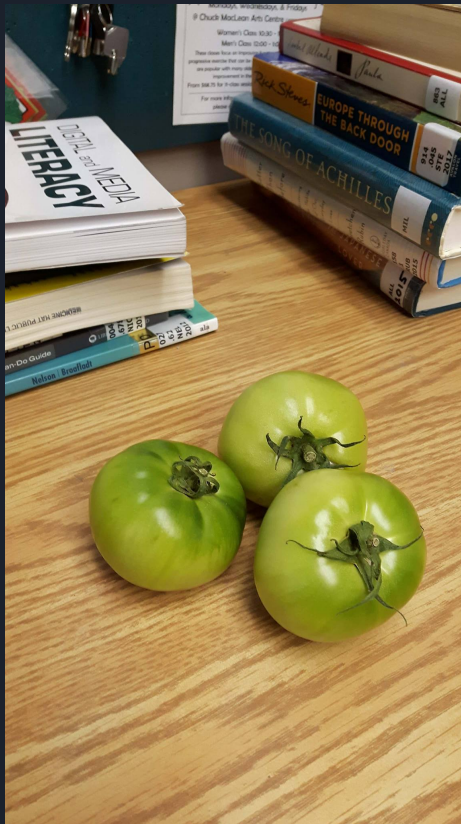

# Tips for teaching tech to seniors

- You can't break it!
- No tech experts needed- just patience
- Be encouraging and flexible
- Start with the basics- and break it down
- Make sure participants are comfortable
- Be prepared! Choose topics your participants are interested in
- Move beyond navigation
- Repeating encourages practice
- Digital literacy skills won't be learned immediately
